Research Program

My research examines how compounding stressors affect the well-being of families, especially Black and Latinx families, and the communication processes (e.g., social support, confirming and disconfirming messages, and the use of narratives) they use that help or hurt their personal and relational health. Using a mixed-methods approach, I consider the intersection of racial and ethnic stigma, chronic stress, mental health, and communication. Currently, my research explores dyadic family conversations about mental health across multiple racial and ethnic groups.

With a series of first-authored projects during my PhD program, I have created a foundation for promising future avenues to explore communication about mental health in the family. In addition to contributing to the development of the knowledge base on mental health communication, I am working to expand the literature regarding people of color, as their

experiences have traditionally been devalued in academia. More specifically, I explore the mechanisms behind cultural differences in communication practices (as the differences have begun to be documented).

Ultimately, I hope to understand the ways minority families can foster resilience and thriving in spite of compounding stressors. Considering the foundational role mental health plays in the well-being of individuals and the family, understanding the best ways to communicate about this stigmatized issue is essential. I have experience with a variety of data collection and analysis techniques.

Methods and Analysis Specialties

- <u>Collection</u>: Mixed methods, biosocial marker data collection techniques, familiar with ego depletion tasks, and dyadic discussion tasks.
- Analysis: Expert in observational coding, thematic coding, thematic analyses, comfortable with advanced statistical techniques (including structural equation modeling). Familiar with SPSS, R, AMOS, and Mplus.
- <u>Recruitment:</u> Creative recruitment techniques to reach Black and Latinx individuals and families across the US (e.g., social media, local organization outreach, snowball sampling)
